



Blazing a modern trail

To kick off our June meeting in Injune, our run coordinator, Donna planned our drive via the Forrestvale road, north of Mitchell to visit the campsite and 2nd base of Major (Sir) Thomas Mitchell's 4th expedition to Darwin. To start off the one hundred and twenty five kilometer first stint to the site, the group met at the Big Rig park to get their orders and directions. Twelve vehicles and one bike set off on a beautiful winter morning with only the one stop required at Mitchell for a refill for the vehicles with small tanks. Once refueled most of the group set off from Mitchell to the camp site with Brett's Mustang refusing to have a drink, talk about leading a horse to water, a tap on the fuel pump and carburetor to loosen some stiff valves and we got the beast to drink and soon joined the lead group. Members setup camp for morning tea on the banks of the Maranoa and enjoyed a social break taking in the bush surroundings and historical displays. After morning tea, we headed off to Hoganthulla Road intersection to see the Flying Fox, a steel basket on a wire that allowed people and goods to be transferred across the Maranoa in times of Flood. After this guick stop and some picture opportunities of some enthusiastic climbers, the group headed off to their designation for BBQ lunch and the meeting at Injune.

Major Mitchell Camp and Moondi Shelter


The Moondi shelter shed commemorates the sesquicentenary of the fourth expedition of Major (Sir) Thomas Mitchell. It is at the campsite where Sir Thomas Mitchell camped in 1846 on his expedition to map an overland route from Sydney to Port Essington (Darwin). A time capsule was also laid at the site.

In 1846 Major Sir Thomas Mitchell was the first European to see the Maranoa River. On his fourth major expedition of exploration he established a major camp site, the second depot of that expedition, on the Maranoa River. The site, now known as Mitchell Water Reserve, is some 40 kilometers north of Mitchell. Major Mitchell arrived there with an advance party on 18 May 1846, and the main party under Edmund Kennedy arrived on 1 June 1846.

Mitchell left Kennedy in charge of the camp and departed northwards on 4 July 1846. He reached the Belyando River, then turned south-west and named the Victoria River in the mistaken idea that it ran to the north. Later Kennedy found the Victoria River was the Barcoo River. Mitchell arrived back at this camp on October 14 and on October 17 all departed to the south.






If, you are a motor enthusiast, and you would like to take part in these activities please:
